


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Warmer weather

As the Spring turns to Summer, thoughts in school naturally turn towards.... sun cream and sun hats! The sun can get pretty strong, and we are continuing to make the most of our brilliant setting with lots of outdoor learning. Please make sure your child has a sun hat on sunny days. It would be a great idea to put sun cream on your child before they come to school (one of the long lasting ones ideally please). We follow NYCC policy, and staff are unable to apply sun cream during the day, so if the children want to be out of the shade, a before-school application would be a great idea. Our EYFS canopy does provide plenty of shade for Owls, and there are lots of cooler leafy areas for the older children too.

Water bottles

And on that note, just a reminder to make sure your child has a water bottle in school, and that it is full of water rather than juice please. Juice is fine if your child is having a packed lunch, and children will be offered a beaker of water if they have forgotten their water bottle. We will be reminding pupils to drink plenty throughout the day, and children have access to their water bottles at all times.


















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
