Cost of Living and Pupil Premium

If you're struggling to pay for food and other essentials, there are local schemes and organisations in North Yorkshire which may be able to help or point you in the right direction. You'll find information about emergency financial support, managing debt, benefit entitlement, energy bills and staying connected all in one place at www.northyorks.gov.uk/costofliving North Yorkshire Council's cost of living web page also has information about pension credit, schemes to help families and local community-based support including Warm Welcome spaces as well as advice on staying safe and well. Please do think about applying for Pupil Premium funding (link here: https://fisportal.northyorks.gov.uk/Synergy/fsm_prereq.aspx). This funding is not just for free school meals, it enables school to support families in a range of ways. Even if your child is in Key Stage 1, and already receiving free school meals as part of universal infant meals, you may well still be eligible for this funding, so don't let it put you off! Once you are successful, the funding stays with your child until the end of their time in primary school.
